It's half-term in the football world.

The Under 8's continue their quest for their first victory of the season. The team are putting in some great performances but without

the success they deserve. They did however taste success at the Xmas event beating the Under 10's at Quasar! Due to the December break and bad weather in January, not many games have been played recently.

It seems that the repair to the pitch following the village bonfire has been successful and the Under 8's and Under 10's can now play on it. The issue for both pitches is still the amount of faeces on them so if you are a dog-walker please respect the fact that youngsters are playing football each week.

The under 10's started the new year in 7th place. Due to several games in hand (and some good play hopefully) they could improve on this and leapfrog their way up the table. The boys have really started to gel and hopefully they can carry this on to the end of the May.

Next season they move up to the revised 9 a side format. As long as we can accommodate the new size pitch required we will be on the lookout for a couple of players to complement the squad.

The Under 14's season is turning around – having won their last 4 matches. No doubt they are looking forward to their end of season tour.

The Under 18 team are enjoying their most competitive season ever in Division B. The teams are well matched with some good games against some competitive teams. Funnily enough there has also been a much more sporting ethos amongst the teams they have played this year, which has been nice. Perhaps philosophically speaking, that is part of growing up - managers as well as players!

With good weather in September, October and November they have played 13 games in total. In the league they have won 4, drawn 3 and lost 5. They stand 5th in the league and are also through to the quarter finals of the league cup, having won through two rounds.

The weather in December and January has, of course, been much less propitious, with heavy rain and then snow and they have only played twice. This has probably been a good thing as they have suffered from a spate of injuries with broken ankles, dislocated shoulders (both rugby!) car crash injuries as well as persistent hamstring and groin niggles, all meaning that a theoretical squad of 16 has been reduced to 11 or 12 on match days.

With all of the team under 18, as opposed to under seventeen, this is the last year in the league and it is excellent that the team, originally managed by our Club Sponsor has played all the way through!

Finally we are scheduling our Awards Evening for Saturday 8 June. "Hope to see you there!"

West Bergholt Traffic Safety Plan

Last summer the Parish Council adopted a Traffic Safety Plan which has its origins in the Parish Plan and has as its aim an enhancement of levels of safety in the village. This plan has been developed by the Environment and Highways Committee of the Parish Council as a result of the ongoing and increasing concerns of village residents. A principal objective of the traffic plan is to improve all aspects of safety in the region of Heathlands School and the surrounding feeder roads. To achieve this measures are needed that will help to slow traffic, restrict parking that is irresponsible in dangerous areas and at the same time provide alternative parking for parents who find it necessary to use a car to transport their children to school.

The plan contains a number of proposals for relatively minor structural work in New Church Road and School Lane. These include parking restrictions at the junctions at each end of New Church Road, better signage to improve awareness of the school and a build out from the footpath from Mumford Close. These plans have now been considered for implementation by the Local Highways Panel and it is good to report that all have been approved. It is pleasing to know that if ideas that come forward from the village are put into a plan and discussed with the authorities concerned they can be developed into realistic projects. As yet there is no news of when the work will take place but the village will be kept informed.

For its part the Parish Council has considered ways of providing alternative parking. The Orpen Hall car park will be resurfaced and facilities improved. The works mentioned above will enhance safety for the walk from the car park to school. The Treble Tile has agreed that subject to certain conditions its car park can be used at school drop off and pick up times. To make safe the walk from here to school a new footpath parallel to School Lane is being installed along the edge of Poors Land.

Throughout this process the Parish Council is in dialogue with the school to ensure that as these modifications are put into place maximum advantage for all concerned is achieved by them. 





The Friends and the Village Bulletin

For some reason I started keeping the Village Bulletin in March 1994 (Issue No. 57) and therefore, when I decided to browse through them to find mention of the Friends, this is where I started. And it couldn't have been better – the first article I saw was:

HILL HOUSE WOOD APPEAL

We did it! Or should I say, YOU did it! Many people said it was impossible (there were times when the organisers thought so, too), but between us we raised £34,000 in six weeks!

And it continued to describe the process for buying the wood, on behalf of the Woodland Trust, through so many people's generosity.

And then, in June 1996, the Bulletin reported that 'Joe Firmin, West Bergholt's well known naturalist, has had a country walk named after him. The Parish Council has agreed that it should be known as "The Joe Firmin Walk".'

This is of interest as Joe was already providing the Friends with much expertise, reporting in the following December issue 'that a colony of white-letter hairstreak butterflies was discovered on elm trees in the wood during the summer. There was a colony of this uncommon species in the wood in the 1950s and early 1960s, but it had apparently died out when elm disease destroyed many of the trees.'

In addition, during the following year, Joe started providing the regular article under his own name. This has continued until recently when, due to some health issues, Joe has decided to take more of a back seat for a time. Therefore I will be standing in which means that you will notice a dramatic fall off in expert knowledge being provided in our forthcoming articles!



It is a lovely setting for anyone's big day. The Friends are also planning the annual Bluebell Opening to coincide with the splendid display in the adjacent wood. This event is planned in conjunction with the friends of Hillhouse Wood. There also are plans for a concert to be held in the building in the summer.

A programme of works required to keep the building in good condition has been written and costed at around £150,000. Although it seems a large figure, it is not unrealisable over several years. This amount would see the repairs to the premises done, the building redecorated, and would even run to the provision of heat and light and other utilities for the building thus extending its potential use for events in the future. The works required initially are to the roof where the lead flashing has deteriorated causing water to get into the walls. This work is to be done as a matter of urgency by the Trust so scaffolding will soon be erected around the building. Whilst the contractors are on site, opportunity will be taken to examine the tower structure to see if any urgent remedial work is required there. The Trust and the Friends group envisage a five year project period to deal with the major works identified, perhaps longer for the non-essential elements.

If any person who loves the old building and wishes to help with the restoration work by direct gift or perhaps a legacy, the Friends would be delighted to hear from them. As a charity any such donations are tax efficient for the donor. Other than any such windfalls, the Friends group will continue to raise funds for the building so it will be there for future generations to enjoy and use. This may prove to be a long task but the results will be worth it.

In the meantime, the Friends welcome any villagers who would like to be associated with the building to join them. Membership is £5 for each family group.

We have eight active members in our group. Since September 2012 one member has left but we have gained Tom who lives in Stanway and is able to cover the West Bergholt area. He has completed his weekend training, spent a day with a paramedic on the Ambulance Rapid Response car and had his first call out which happened to be in Great Horkesley.

All active members successfully completed their annual re-testing in September with very positive comments from the examiner.

In November we were very fortunate to receive a £220 donation from Waitrose from their community token scheme. We have used the bulk of it to purchase combat trousers for each member plus a few spares for any future members.

A new call out system for community first responders has been commenced by the Ambulance Service. We have always had a dedicated mobile phone but instead of the initial contact being a personal call we are going to be sent a text message to alert us of a possible call. We then acknowledge receipt by text and set off to the address. We will always speak to a member of the control team before attending the patient to check that it is an appropriate call for a responder. It is hoped that this will speed the response time.

Compared with the rest of the county our call out rate is very low but even so we have never been able to cover 24/7 due to lack of members.
